#### **Announcements:**

- -The 3rd National Video Portrait Competition announces its winners.
- -The AmérAsia Film Festival successfully brings ethnic communities together and continues this weekend, March 11-13.

AmérAsia Film Festival announced the winners of the annual "National Video Portrait Competition". A total of nine film and videos of approximately 5 minutes in length competed on March 4th at J.A De Sève at Concordia University. The first prize, Vidéographe Award went to *L'hybridée* by Julie Corbeil. This video portrait is about an Asian girl adopted by a Caucasian couple who becomes curious about her origins and travels to discover her own roots.

Launched by Ciné-Asie in 2008, the video competition has been created to encourage and discover young emerging film and video makers who are inspired by Asian themes. This year the video competition has been integrated into the AmérAsia Film Festival.

The **Videographe Award** (distribution services) went to **L'hybridée** by **Julie Corbeil**. The **GIV** (Groupe Intervention Video) award, a \$1,000 value of post-production services, went to **Sign off** by **Diyan Achjadi**. The **Ciné-Asie Award**, a 3-night stay at the Hotel Marriott Downtown, went to **Xi Feng** for **Escape**. And finally, the **Public Award**, a 3-night stay at the Lord Berri Hotel, went to **Un Casse-Tête**, **un Pays**, **un Monde** by **Philippe Iskandar**.

This competition acts as a platform for emerging artists to showcase to their arts. Last year's winners: Nguyen-Anh Nguyen of Montreal (*Mon Nom Est Tuan*), Jason Karman of Vancouver (*State of Yo*) and Kelly-Anne Riess of Regina (*A Tall Tale*) are now all very active in the film industry.

This year's jury was comprised of various film and video artisans specialized in film-making, directing, film critique and distribution, namely:

- Masoud Raouf, an Iranian filmmaker based in Canada (Blue Like A Gunshot (2003))
- Aisling Chin-Yee, a filmmaker currently working on two feature films, *Breaking the Band* and *The Killing of the Family Dog*
- **Denis Vaillancourt,** distributor at Videographe, with more than 20 years of experience in the arts
- Mathieu Li-goyette, editor-in-chief of the French Canadian web-zine, Panorama-cinéma



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The return of the **AmérAsia** film festival, after 12 years of absence, was well received by the Montreal public. **AmérAsia** celebrates the diversity of Asian and Canadian culture and its integration in Canada. The festival presents more than **22** international films and videos from 10 countries, with this year's highlight on South Korean cinema. Moreover, **5** special events comprising of practical workshops and seminars will be presented to film professionals and the general public.

The festival continues this weekend, from March 11th to 13th with internationally acclaimed and award-winning films as well as informative seminars at Cinérobothèque - National Film Board of Canada located near Berri UQAM metro station (Saint-Denis exit).
